Scheduled Drug Policy

To all patients of Luxury Psychiatry:

The prescribers at Luxury Psychiatry take your health and the seriousness of the current opioid/controlled substance epidemic into consideration when treating you for your condition.

Initials

_____ Any prescriber at Luxury Psychiatry has the right to refuse to prescribe controlled substances if not clinically indicated by the FDA, if there is a risk of abuse to patients, or if patients are getting narcotics/any other scheduled drugs from other providers.

_____ If you're getting pain medication from another provider, Luxury Psychiatry will safely slow down and stop your current medications, such as Ativan, Xanax, Valium, etc., since these drugs should not be given with opioids.

_____ Luxury Psychiatry does not prescribe pain medication.

_____ **Arguing, bullying and demanding scheduled drugs with the prescriber will not be tolerated and will result in immediate discharge from the practice.**

_____ Xanax/alprazolam, Valium/diazepam, Ativan/lorazepam, Klonopin/clonazepam, Ambien/zolpidem, Lunesta/eszopiclone, and Adderall/d,l-amphetamine, and other medications under the same family, are common drugs people can be prescribed for treatment and would fall into the discretion of the provider.

_____ Luxury Psychiatry prescribers do utilize and check the Illinois/Florida prescription drug monitoring program that looks at scheduled drugs being filled under the patient's name. It also tags patients who are simultaneously getting opioids from other prescribers.

_____ Luxury Psychiatry also has the right to request random urine drug screens.

_____ Asking to predate or call in refills for scheduled medications is not allowed. You need to make an appointment. This includes leaving town/going on vacation. Additionally, certain states do not accept prescription refill requests for controlled substances.

_____ Refills will not be done without a provider visit. Lost, misplaced, or stolen medications will not be refilled, no exceptions/arguments.

_____ **Any patient needing a controlled substance needs a face-to-face appointment with the provider prior to the prescription being sent to be compliant with the DEA guidelines.**
